


# Classical Chorales

## About the Piece

Classical Chorales is a set of five “classical music” pieces arranged in a chorale/teaching style for concert band. This set includes: New World Symphony (Dvorak), 1812 Overture (Tchaikovsky), Piano Concerto No. 5 (Beethoven), Abendfeier in Venedig (C. Schumann), Ave Corpus Verum (Mozart). The dynamics and specific musical markings have been stripped away to give the director/teacher the most leeway. For example, maybe you want to work only at softer mp-p-pp dynamics. Another customizable option would be to have the ensemble follow the conducting: dynamics, style/articulation, tempo, etc.

This series aims to assist both young and old musicians in connecting with classical music. Studying and practicing these pieces can establish a sense of familiarity that may spark interest in the original compositions. And while Bach’s chorales are exceptional (the industry standard!), these new arrangements can add some variety to the repertoire.

I recommend listening to the chorales in their original setting and having a conversation about musicality and interpretation. Encouraging young musicians to listen to various recordings can help refine their listening skills. Music educators understand that music is multi-layered, and one can spend their entire life listening, learning, and reflecting. These chorales can serve as a valuable tool for developing a rich ensemble sound and further instilling a lifelong love of music.

## About the Composer

John McAllister is a composer, educator, and conductor based in Spartanburg, South Carolina. He received his Bachelor of Music Degree from Furman University in Music Education. After graduation, he spent fourteen years teaching in Spartanburg School District #7 where he taught all levels of secondary band (5th grade-12th grade). John was fortunate enough to be named teacher of the year at both McCracken Middle School (in 2015) and Spartanburg High School (in 2020). Ensembles under his director found much success, receiving numerous superior ratings at local and regional festivals.

His passion for composing/arranging have merged with his band directing, leading him to create John McAllister Music ([www.johnmcallistermusic.com](http://www.johnmcallistermusic.com)). The website houses his compositions and arrangements, but the most robust section is the “free resources.” Here there are warm-ups, fundamentals, and numerous other resources for music educators. John especially enjoys creating cinematic accompaniments and other engaging play-alongs for young musicians.

A majority of John’s compositions and arrangements center around creating exciting and engaging music for young performers. He writes for concert band, orchestra, and chamber ensembles. He has also been writing custom marching band shows for more than two decades. In addition to writing for performing ensembles, he also writes for the screen. He has scored numerous films, video games, and commercials. Placements have ranged from nationally televised commercials (i.e. on CBS) to popular YouTube Channels (i.e. HISHE). His collaborations with filmmaker Kane Farabaugh have led to multiple Emmy award winning films.
